State's Largest Physician Organization Praises Governor's Action to Protect Patient Safety

The following statement regarding Gov. Tony Evers' veto of 2023 Senate Bill 145 can be attributed to Wisconsin Medical Society President Don Lee, MD:

Madison, WI — "We agree with Governor Tony Evers' decision to veto this APRN legislation. The bill the Legislature passed lacked the minimum levels of patient protections we believe are needed for a state to move toward allowing independent nursing health care practice. Every Wisconsin patient deserves to know that an independent nurse practitioner has spent a reasonable minimum number of years training and gaining experience, will properly collaborate with a qualified physician if pain medicine is needed, and will not be misled by confusing and potentially deceptive advertising.

"While we continue to advocate for physician-led health care teams, we appreciate Governor Evers' willingness to find a fair and reasonable path forward on APRN legislation that could have been signed into law. Unfortunately, this APRN legislation fell short."
