EMERGENCY MOTION TO STAY COURT'S ORDER GRANTING A STAY OF THE PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

Learner Daniel Abrams Environmental Law & Policy Center 35 East Wacker Drive, Suite 1600 Chicago, IL 60601 (312) 673-6500 HLearner@elpc.org DAbrams@elpc.org Plaintiff-Appellees National Wildlife Refuge Association, Driftless Area Land Conservancy, and Wisconsin Wildlife Federation hereby move for a stay of this Court's Order (Doc. 27) staying the effectiveness of the district court's preliminary injunction while Plaintiffs concurrently move in the district court for a temporary restraining order and preliminary injunction to enjoin the closing of the land exchange agreement and any construction in the federally protected Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge. In accordance with Fed. R. App. P. 8(a)(2)(A), Plaintiff-Appellees move first in this Court because moving before the district court first would be impracticable, as explained below.

Intervenor-Appellants have stated their intention to begin construction in the Refuge as soon as possible. *See* Dist. Ct. Doc. 72 at 1 ("A stay would allow the Utilities to consummate the land exchange . . . and build the last portion of the Cardinal-Hickory Project Work to complete the Project could proceed while the parties brief summary judgment motions and any further appeals."). Time is of the essence. Plaintiff-Appellees have briefed the issues identified by this Court, namely whether the agency's action is legally forbidden and how the Court should consider of 42 U.S.C. Section 4370m-6(b)(1) & (2) (the "Fast Act"). Plaintiffs will move today in the district court for a renewed motion for temporary restraining order and preliminary injunction. The district court should be afforded an opportunity to address this Court's decision prior to any land exchange closing and construction begins which would cause irreparable

harm to Plaintiffs and the federally protected Refuge.
